Greetings!

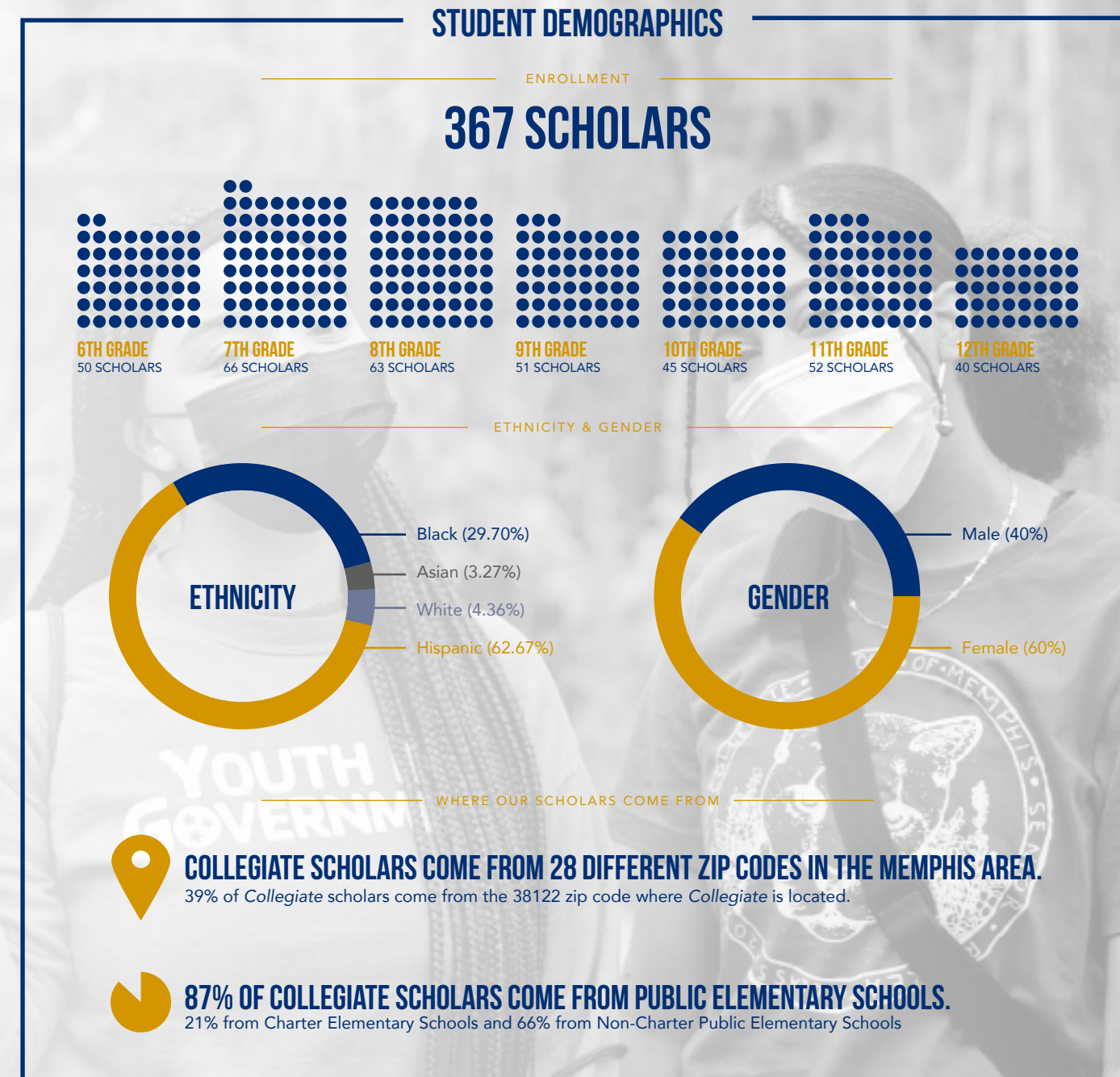

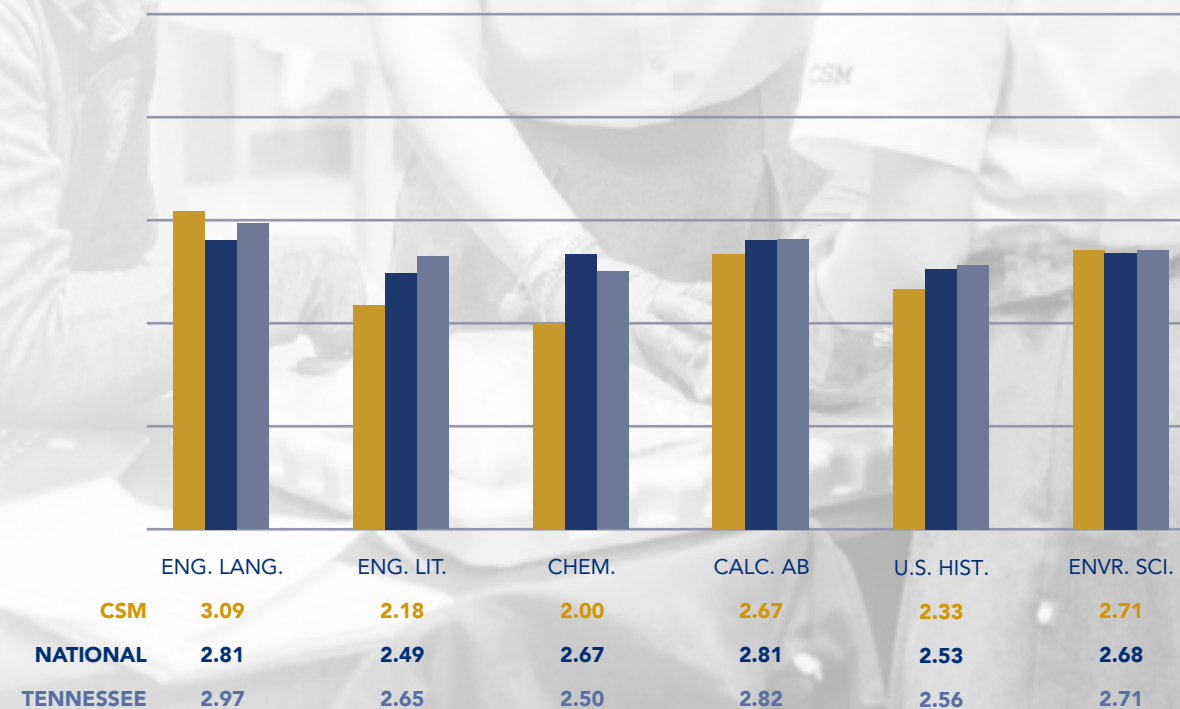

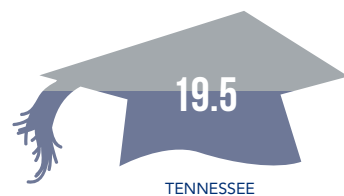
