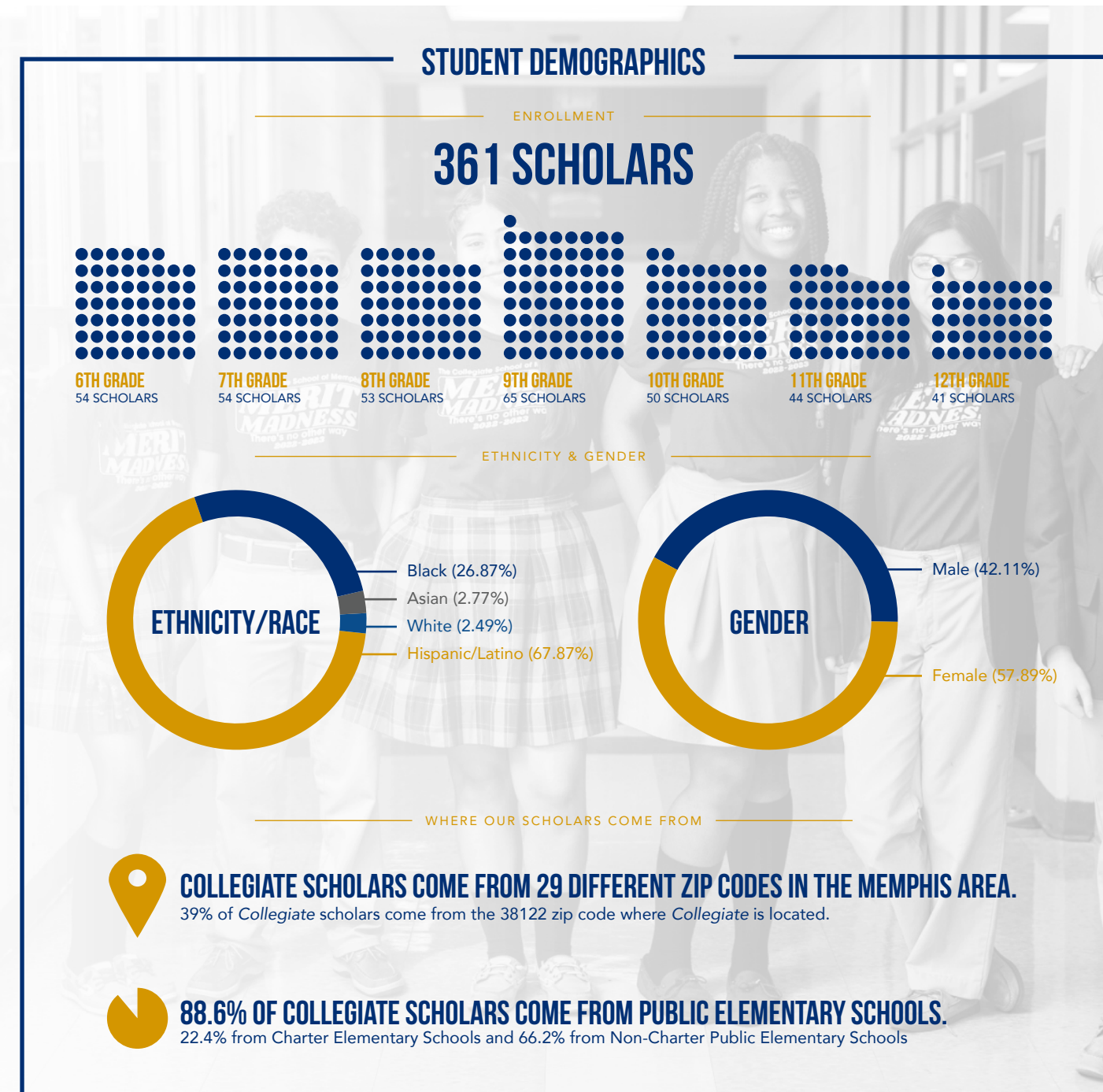

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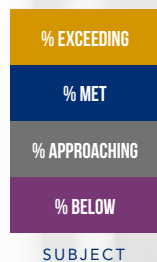
What I like most from our Community Group Character Development time is being able to hear from different grade levels. By being exposed to different people in our groups, we all learn something different and see the world in a different perspective.

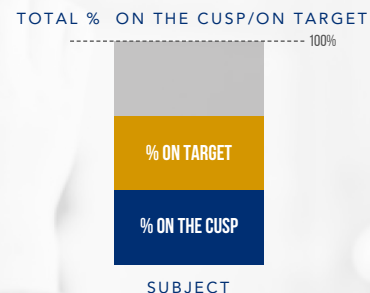
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TCAP (6 AND 7 GRADES) AND PREACT[™] (8, 9, AND 10 GRADES)
